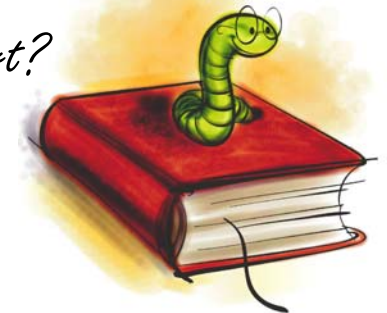

In the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, the following requirements must be met for an individual to take the GED test. *You must:*

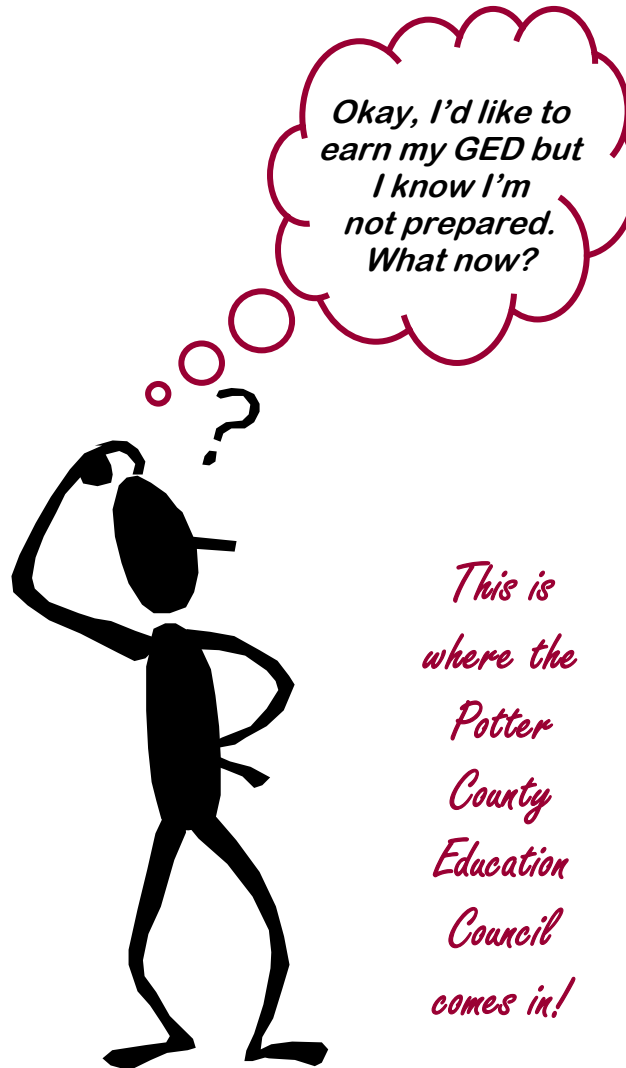
- be 18 years of age, or 16 with special documentation from an employer, college admissions office, military recruiting officer, or director of a state institution
- not be currently enrolled in school
- have not received a high school credential from any state
- have not earned a GED in any state
- be a resident of Pennsylvania

The five subjects covered on the GED test are:

- Math
- Social Studies
- Science
- Language Arts
- Writing

Please be aware that GED testing costs vary, depending on the testing site. The typical cost ranges between \$40 and \$60 for all five tests.
