## Things to consider

How do you know if your child is ready for school? Well the PA office of Child Development and Early Learning tells us a child who is creative, social, independent, thinks and listens is ready.

## What you can do

To develop your child's creativity provide them with a variety of items such as: plastic bottles, boxes, bottle caps, paper, string, glue and tape. Make sure all items are clean and no sharp edges.

- Encourage your child to make anything they wish from the items.
- Ask your child to describe the creation before starting to make it. This step encourages the skill of planning.
- Ask your child to describe the creation when done. This helps the child develop skills of describing things as well a speaking and thinking aloud.
- Be sure to display the item where it can be seen by others.
