What you can do

- Read to your infant and preschooler.
- Explore available Early Childhood programs at your school and in your community.
- Read to your child, provide books that match the child's age and ability to follow along or read
- Once your child starts school stay on top of assignments, papers brought home.
- Stay in converstion with teachers about your childs' progress.
- Be encouraging to your child as he attempts to learn.
